NO APPOINTMENT NEEDED – OPEN TO THE PUBLIC

DEPOSIT IN "SCRAP METAL" BIN



Large Metal Items that do not fit in your recycling bin...

Metal lawn chairs, metal pipes, microwaves, metal sinks, metal & screen doors, etc.

**NO PROPANE TANKS
NO GAS CANS**

DEPOSIT IN "MIXED CONTAINERS" BIN

PLEASE EMPTY AND RINSE ALL CONTAINERS



All PLASTIC Containers must be a container.
GLASS Bottles & Jars- clear, brown, green & blue.
METAL- cans & lids, pie tins, aluminum trays & foil,

metal clothes hangers, pots, pans, toasters, faucets, silverware, utensils, pipes & other small metal items, empty paint & aerosol cans.

NEW Items as of July 2008



1 Empty beverage & food boxes, milk cartons, paper cups, drink & juice boxes.

2 Blue and green glass bottles and jars.



**NO STYROFOAM – NO PLASTIC BAGS
NO WINDOW GLASS**

DEPOSIT IN "FIBER" BIN



Newspapers, glossy ads, magazines, catalogs, phone books, window envelopes, construction paper, manila folders (no metal clamps), paperback books, loose-leaf paper, computer paper, carbonless forms, shredded paper, junk mail, office and school paper, brown paper bags, paperboard and cardboard.

NO STYROFOAM



1 Plastic Bags- clean, empty, no twine or plastic handles.



2 Paper Shredding- bring your personal documents and shred them yourself.



3 Hardcover Books.



4 Discs, Tapes, CDs, DVDs, VHS, Cassettes, and Floppy Discs, (cases recycled separately in shed)



Drop your used clothing, shoes, blankets, and toys in the IICD clothes collection bins.



Lead acid-batteries- accepted by staff person at the household hazardous waste shed (white trailer).
